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REPORT SUMMARY

Background

The 2015 Undergraduate Student Survey (USS) is the first administration of the USS. The USS is a complementary survey to the *Graduating Student Survey (GSS)* and was administered to sophomores and juniors in April 2015. The USS was created for two reasons:

- The GSS, administered every semester, should focus on those students in their last semesters at TAMU-CC and their more immediate experiences at TAMU-CC. While it is important also to capture the information regarding student services during their time at TAMU-CC, it was determined that by the time students are graduating, their experiences two or three years earlier do not lend themselves to immediate continuous improvement in areas of concern. Sophomores and juniors are still in classes and can have a current impact on the services they utilize.
- The GSS had gotten quite lengthy. Research indicates that the longer a survey is the less likely students are to complete it. It was determined that by creating two separate instruments, each would be shorter than one whole, and might therefore increase response rates. Streamlining these two surveys was thus deemed appropriate.

The questions in this survey were mostly taken from the GSS, however a few have changed wording slightly or been added. They are identified as new or with different wording in the report. As with the previous GSS reports, this survey report includes what the questions were rated the last time they were asked -which would have been on the 2013-14 GSS.

Two questions on this survey also appear on the *2014-15 GSS*. They are:

1. If you were to start all over again, would you attend TAMU-CC?
2. Would you recommend TAMU-CC to a prospective student?

Demographics

Although 3,947 students were invited to take the survey, 742 students responded for a response rate of 19%. Male students are underrepresented in the respondent population. More than twice as many females as males responded to the survey

KEY FINDINGS

Campus Experiences

The items receiving the **highest** ratings of combined satisfaction in campus experiences are as follows:

- The ease of dropping/adding courses (97%)
- The cleanliness of Recreational Sports facilities and equipment (97%)
- The safety of Recreational Sports facilities and equipment (97%)
- The overall safety of the campus (96%)
- SAIL Online Portal (96%)
- The Bell Library (95%)
- The courtesy of personnel in Admissions & Records (95%)
- Recreational Sports facilities (95%)
- Momentum shuttle bus service (95%)

The items receiving the **lowest** ratings of satisfaction in general experiences, under the recommended 75%, are as follows:

- Campus dining options (**59%**).
- The availability of channels for expressing student complaints (**64%**).

Noteworthy items

- *The contribution of intercollegiate athletic programs to your sense of school spirit*, which rated just above the recommended level at 76%, was the only other item, other than the two above, to rate below 82%. This is markedly improved from the results of the 2013-14 GSS when four items rated below 64%.
- The score for the courtesy of campus police increased dramatically to 89% from the 2013-14 GSS where it was only 57%.
- The satisfaction with walk-up registration also increased markedly to 89% from 76% on the 2013-14 GSS.
- Many students noted that classes were closed when they went to register (95 marked "always" and 152 marked "often"). Another 202 said they were closed "sometimes".
- Not surprisingly, the results show that graduating students use the admission and records office, as well as Campus Copies, more frequently than undergraduates (pp. 7 & 10).
- The response percentages on this USS survey were very similar to those on last year's GSS survey, meaning that the juniors and sophomores answered generally the same as the graduating seniors.
- One student comments is very enlightening:
 - There's more than two genders. In an effort to recognize the diversity of students on campus, I'd recommend having options other than the typically male/female. I did not feel comfortable with the options available.

About the response numbers:

Respondents did not necessarily answer all questions on the survey. Therefore the total number of responses will not necessarily match other questions.

About percentages:

Valid percent means the percentage based on the number of people who answered the question, not the percentage of all the people who answered any question. Percentages are rounded to the nearest whole number, except when less than 1% in which case the exact percentage is reported.

The only problem I have had is that when registering for nursing classes the book lists used for the classes, and the university book store seem to never quite be in sync. I am not sure if it is the professors that do not update syllabus' or a break in communication, but I know that student's living away from Corpus Christi experience the same problems. Many books today come with access codes instead of cd/dvd's. There always seem to be confusion in whether it is required or necessary to purchase a book with an access code. I generally always purchase new books that come with new access codes, and with the price of new books it is discouraging finding out that once the class has started that the access code was not even necessary of visa versa. Generally I try and wait for the specific classes syllabus. I've looked at the SAIL book list before and it does not always accurately reflect what is actually needed. The other confusion is that the university book store tries jto bundle groups of books, and for student's trying to purchase online for the bookstore, finding exactly what is in the bundle is not always an easy task. It would be nice if when registering for a class the professor's made sure of what books and codes were needed and a checks and balancing system to ensure that SAIL, and the university bookstore all have the same information.

Though I do appreciate the convenience online courses provides, I would like to have seen more in-class time availability options in pharmacology.

On a personal level, I really wish that the Office of Nursing would reconsider accepting pre-requisite courses and hours earned from students with Paramedic licenses, such as they would with Nurses. Realizing there is a different level of care provided between Nurses and Paramedics, the main concepts from Pre-requisite Sciences such as chemistry, anatomy, and microbiology are still engrained in the student's mind. Especially if they currently work in the medical field. This is something the department should look at to allow more ease for medical students such as LVNs and Paramedics to transition faster and smoother, rather than make them repeat several courses. It can be discouraging and influence the student to look elsewhere to finish college. There are many online courses that offer transition from paramedic to RN. Not many trust it, choose this route, like me. Overall TAMUCC college is excellent in all ways, but really wish they could reconsider providing ease of having a faster opportunity for Paramedics to apply to the Nurse program, due to their past college education and completed curriculum and work experience.

College of Science and Engineering Students:

I have been very satisfied with the way this campus is run. My courses are great. I like all my professors and their way of teaching.

I have found it quite good in most classes, but there are two that are/were difficult due to the professors teaching them. I do not mean the material or class or accent, but instead the teaching style and deceptive grading procedures. Besides that, I have enjoyed my time here and found that most teachers are there to help you. I have really learned a lot and made excellent connections, helping push forward with my collegiate career and understand more about the university. Overall, it has been an awesome time, a great educational experience.

The campus to me seems to focus more on how it looks than what happens in the classroom. This is my first semester at TAMUCC and most of my teachers have fallen back from their syllabus. One teacher said there would be quizzes every week and there has only been two the entire semester. How can I test my knowledge without quizzes? Or feel like I am improving without the teacher grading my work instead of them just lecturing straight off of the powerpoint. Please look to the teachers and how they are instructing as well as looking professional. If the students don't learn and barely get by how can they have improved themselves and feel like they truly earned their degree?

Great campus, great programs, great professors. I would recommend people depending on what they want to pursue. Every school is slightly different and helping people find a program that would help them thrive educationally is a foremost responsibility of any mentor over choosing your own school first.

Overall educational experience at TAMU-CC is exceptional. Over the past years attending, learning material was enlightening, as well as challenging.

Overall quality of some classes seems very poor. Several instructors obviously do not have any teacher training and may be very intelligent in their field but do not know how to teach. Some professors make it quite clear that they are on campus to do their research and could care less about teaching in the classroom. While I have had a few good professors, the quality of probably more than half the classes I've taken has been disappointing. The chemistry department is by far the most disappointing quality of class that I've ever taken. The professors all assume that we have the same amount of knowledge that they do and you either fail or pass due to the professor "letting" you pass by a tremendous curve. In four semesters of chemistry, I've honestly learned nothing in a single chemistry lecture on this campus. The professors really don't seem to care and most have actually almost become angry when asking questions. It's pretty clear that some professors think they have better things to do than help their students.

I've also had several professors that have obvious favorite students and will basically refuse help to anyone else. The wording on exams in my Biology 1406 and 1407 class was very poor. The instructor was unwilling to listen when the wording on the exam clearly meant something different to what he had intended. When asking questions about the wording during the exam time, I was refused an explanation while a female student sitting right behind me asked the exact same thing and was basically given the answer. Overall, I've been extremely disappointed with the quality of the education I've received so far on this campus. I have heard that in upper-level classes, the instructors care more about the field which makes for better classes. This should avoid having a general biology class where all we learn is botany since the instructor admits not knowing how to teach anything else from the textbook.

There are not enough classes available for mechanical engineering. There have been multiple semesters where I have not been able to get into a class that is a prerequisite for future classes that I need to take.

I am not very satisfied with my Academic Advisor. I have sent two emails before registration and NEVER heard back from her.
